Progress and assessment



All Yamaha Music Point courses are designed to help students progress to higher levels. Compared with lessons where an exam syllabus is used as the only curriculum, Yamaha courses enable students to tackle a broader range of musical activities with greater confidence.

Each course offers a fully accredited exam syllabus available, produced in partnership with leading UK examination boards and based on our Yamaha course materials. We use exams not as a target for students but to confirm their achievement.

Keyboard Courses

Our keyboard courses help students acquire a broad range of musical skills, which means they can function in a wide range of musical situations. There are two courses, depending on the age of the beginner.

Junior Play For Keeps

Our *Junior Play For Keeps* course is designed for children beginning on keyboard at the age of 6-7 years old, when their attention spans and fine motor skills increase rapidly. This course capitalises on these opportunities, providing a fun approach to learning music which includes listening, singing, playing and reading activities.

On completion of the *Junior Play For Keeps* course, usually after about 3 years, children may graduate to the *Play For Keeps* course, joining at around grade 3 level.

Play For Keeps

The *Play For Keeps* course has been designed to help beginners aged 9 to 99 learn keyboard skills in a fun and creative environment. *Play For Keeps* is the best choice for those who may want to become a versatile working keyboard player later on, as well as those learning just for fun. Key skills covered in the course include: keyboard-style and piano-style techniques, solo and ensemble playing, arranging, improvising, music notation, theory and practical aural skills.

A fully accredited examination syllabus based on the materials for both keyboard courses, is available, designed and delivered in partnership with Trinity College London.





Guitar Encounters

Guitar Encounters is a rock/pop-based course for electric/electroacoustic guitar for aspiring guitarists, from age 8 to adult.
